- Academics

Mrs. Ramey shared progress on GSA. CCE increase 6 points in ELA, 8 points in math and 15 points in science from last year.

Mrs. Ramey shared the school wide title one plan including staffing and resources that are funded by Title One.

- Facilities

Mrs. Ramey shared that in the past the board, through LSIC requests have provided new flooring throughout the building, new HVAC and nightlocks for all classrooms.

Crystal Gathings asked about special needs equipment for the playground. Mrs. Ramey explained that several items were purchased through Donor's Choose last year. Mr. Waugh is continuing to solicit donors for additional equipment.

Another parent asked about Dyslexia training for staff and screening for students. Mrs. Ramey explained that HB 3035 requires dyslexia training for teachers and interventions for students scoring below level on diagnostics. She also explained the SAT process and referred the parent to Ms. McCourt, the SAT coordinator for more information.
